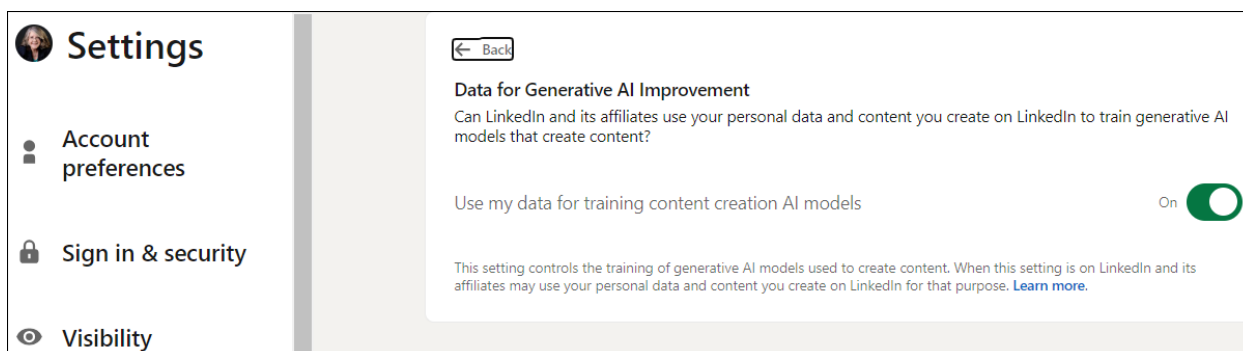
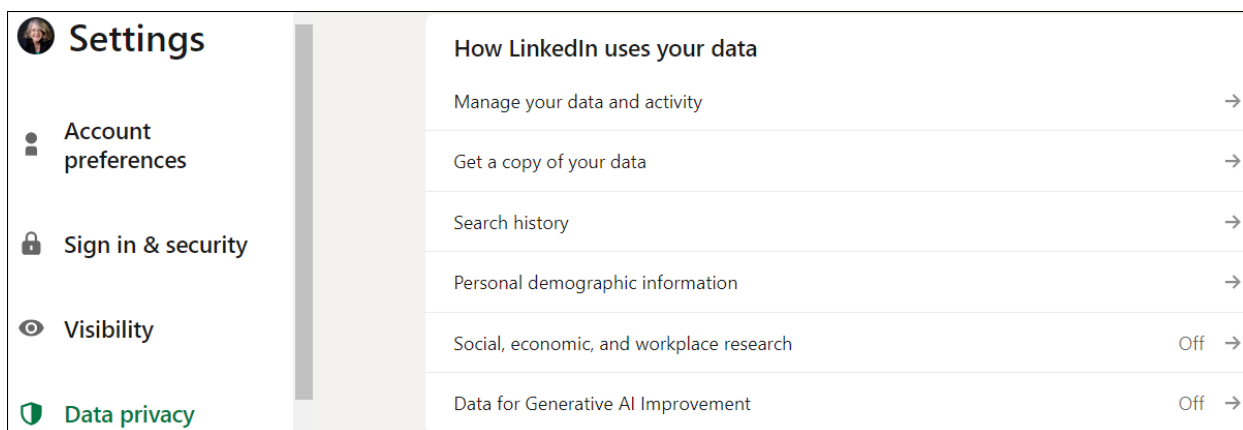
◆ LinkedIn using our content and data to train its AI

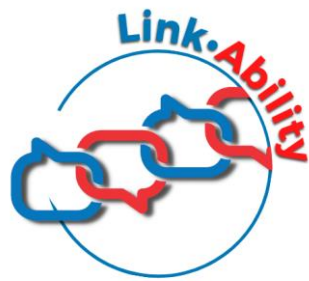
